Nationwide Drug Take-Back Day

On April 26 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. local law enforcement and the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) will give the public another opportunity to properly dispose of unused, unneeded, and/or expired over-the-counter and prescription medications.

Area drop off locations will be held at the following sites from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. The service is free and anonymous.

- **Fort Collins:** Fort Collins Police Services, 2221 S. Timberline Road
Colorado State University, Green Hall, 750 S. Meridian Ave.
- **Loveland:** Loveland Police Department, 810 E. 10th St.
- **Estes Park:** Rocky Mountain Pharmacy, 453 East Wonderview Avenue
- **Windsor:** 200 N. 11th
- **Wellington:** Wellington Fire Station #1, 8130 3rd Street
- **Red Feather:** Fire Station at 44 Firehouse Lane

Additionally, Fort Collins Police Services now offers a daily drug take-back service that complements the Nationwide DEA Drug Take-Back events.

Residents may now safely dispose of unused, unneeded and expired over-the-counter and prescriptions medications any day of the week to Fort Collins Police Services, 2221 S. Timberline Rd., Monday through Friday, 8 am – 10 pm; Saturday & Sunday, 8 am – 6 pm. This service is free & anonymous.

Items not accepted include: intravenous solutions, injectables, syringes, mercury (thermometers), oxygen containers, chemotherapy/radioactive substances, pressurized canisters and illicit drugs.
